

# Class Lessons - The Heroes Club

## Fictitious Situations & Virtue Opportunities

### Purpose:

To challenge the students to consider how applying a virtue can be beneficial in a real-life (yet fictitious) situation.

### Materials:

- Virtue Opportunities worksheets – one per virtue

### Recommended Uses:

Each worksheet contains a reference to a trading card, incorporating the virtue, it's definition, and the hero. At the top of the worksheet is a paragraph which presents a situation which most kids can identify with. The situation contains a problem or a challenge which can be addressed by practicing the specific virtue listed (and/or incorporating other approaches, too). The remainder of the worksheet allows the student to answer the questions:

- 1. How would you apply *virtue* to this situation? and**
- 2. What are the results that might happen if you do so?**

The worksheets can be incorporated as a “weekly” assignment, using them in conjunction with or instead of the Virtue Call To Action worksheets.

The worksheets can be used as a part of the classroom discussion. The teacher reads the paragraph and the students can offer ideas to answer the questions.

For advanced work, you may want to:

- Explore a broader definition of the virtue (with similar concepts, also)
- Ask the students to describe other possible (fictitious) situations.
- Include discussions of recent or current events, too.
